



Overview of Program

The Access to Language (AtL) ecosystem has disrupted the current system for children who are DHH in the Grady network and throughout Georgia. The current state of Georgia shows that **32%** of babies who are DHH receive a diagnosis by **3** months of age. The efforts of AtL deliver new hope as **94%** of the babies enrolled in their work received a diagnosis by **2** months of age. The possibilities of a transformation of Georgia's system are enormous and the end of developmental delays due to lack of access to language is within reach. The AtL team (including the work of multiple collaborative parties) is underway.
